
# CAS-E Newsletter 01/2024

## Impressions from the CAS-E Conference 2023

Our second international CAS-E conference took place from November 15 to 17, 2023, at the conference center Forschungscampus Waischenfeld. The conference centered on the discussion of "The Politics of Authenticity in Esoteric Practices." The meeting was divided into five themes, each dealing with a particular principle organizing claims of authenticity, its politics and thus its efficacy: (1) nature and the body as source and resource; (2) margins, Circulations and Boundaries; (3) portability and presence; (4) spatiotemporal origins recovered and remade; and (5) science as legitimizing and delegitimizing means. <u>Read more</u>.



SURROUNDED BY THE SPIRITS: PAUL STOLLER AND THE SONGHAY JOURNEY TOWARDS WELLBEING September 29, 2023 – December 1, 2024


Honoring the life work of renowned anthropologist Paul Stoller, Surrounded by the Spirits: Paul Stoller and the Songhay Journey Towards Wellbeing invites us to experience the culture of West Africa, and gain profound insights into holistic healing practices that place us in harmony with the social, natural and spiritual worlds. With rare artifacts from Niger and Ghana, the exhibition examines the varied healing practices of the Songhay people of Nigerincluding spirit possession, witchcraft and divination, Islamic religious devotion, and traditional medicine. A second retrospective gallery looks at the life of Stoller, who trained as a Songhay sorcerer's apprentice, conducted urban ethnography among the West African diaspora, and is internationally recognized for his evocative and accessible writing style. A professor of anthropology at West Chester University for his entire career, Stoller is the author of over 15 books and the recipient of numerous awards including the Anders Retzius Medal given by the King of Sweden, the highest honor in anthropology.






