Prof. Dr. Andreas Nehring

Andreas Nehring (*1957), Dr. theol. is Professor em. for Religious Studies and Intercultural Theology at the Friedrich-Alexander-University,

Erlangen-Nürnberg. He has been visiting Professor at the University of Salzburg, Makumira University in Tanzania, the LTS in Hong Kong, as well as in Malaysia and Myanmar. At present he is one of CAS-E's directors. His fields of research are: Theories of Religious and Cultural Studies. Postcolonial Theologies, Transcultural Processes of Exchange and Communication between Europe and India, History of Missions, Mindfulness, and the Reception of Buddhist Concepts in the West.

Dr. Bernd-Christian Otto

Dr. Bernd-Christian Otto is one of the founding members of CAS-E and works as a permanent fellow at the Center. Trained in religious studies, Otto's research focuses on Western magic and esotericism, where he combines different methodologies such as conceptual history, discourse analysis, interviews. participant observation and practitionerscholarship. Otto is also co-founder and scientific director of the Research Network for the Study of Esoteric Practices (RENSEP), a charitable association that builds bridges between scholars and practitioners and funds cutting-edge research.



Dr. Lina Aschenbrenner

CAS-E research coordinator Lina Aschenbrenner holds a PhD in the study of religion with a background in cultural studies. She researches practices of contemporary neospiritualities in global(ized) consumer societies with a particular focus on aesthetics and embodiment, as well as global assemblages of neoindigenous spiritualities, especially Hawaiian hula. In both contexts, she concentrates on the question of agency and power.



Zheng Liu

CAS-E Alumni Zheng Liu researches the transmission of the *Yijing* (Book of Changes), and four divination techniques based on or derived from the *Yijing* in contemporary China. As an insider and academic, her project focuses especially on the construction and maintenance of secret knowledge.




Geetha Sai Mada

Recap

Conference: "The Aesthetics of Esoteric Practices: Materialities, Performances, Senses"



November 12–14, 2024

This year's CAS-E conference "The Aesthetics of Esoteric Practices" was jointly organized by CAS-E, the Giorgio Cini Foundation (Centre for Comparative Studies of Civilisations and Spiritualities), the Center for the History of Hermetic Philosophy and Related Currents at the University of Amsterdam, and the Research Network for the Study of Esoteric Practices (RENSEP). The conference took place in a very special location, the island of San Giorgio Maggiore in Venice, Italy. The conference's numerous contributions dealt with a topic that has long been on the research agenda of our center: the aesthetics of esoteric practices, i.e. their performative, sensory, and material dimensions. Over the course of three days, the topic was widely discussed in various global, social, cultural, and historical contexts, with each contribution highlighting a different aspect and thus contributing to the overall picture and discourse. The conference program is still available and provides a good overview. The conference proceedings will be published. Until then, we will take home many insights into new fields of practice as well as fruitful discussions that will contribute to the research activities at our center.

Study Day with Prof. Fan-sen Wang: "Symbolic Action in Late Imperial China"

November 21, 2024

On November 21, 2024, CAS-E hosted a <u>one-day workshop</u> featuring <u>Prof. Fan-sen Wang</u> 王汎森 from Academia Sinica, Taiwan. Prof. Wang, who was awarded the Humboldt Research Award 2024, presented his ongoing book project on "Symbolic Action in Late Imperial China 中國近世歷史中的象徵性行動."

The workshop comprised of two sessions. The first session was devoted to a general outline of the book, including a definition of "symbolic action," and its relevance to the social and cultural dynamics of late imperial China. In the second session, Prof. Wang presented a detailed account of Chapter 2, which deals with customs such as "leaving the boots behind 留靴" and the "people's umbrella 萬民傘." These customs exemplify forms of symbolic interaction between local officials and the communities they served, offering unique insights into grassroots expressions of gratitude and critique. Both sessions (5 hours in total) were followed by a lively discussion with the audience, including CAS-E visiting scholars and guests from Germany, Taiwan and China.
